I. ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

1st International Scientific Conference Globalization of Migration, Anti-Immigrant Parties and Xenophobia in the European Union: Reflection on European societies and States in the 21st Century will be held, October 26, 2019, in Split, Croatia, organized by an international team headed by the Institute for Migration and Ethnic Studies Zagreb in cooperation with the and Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, University of Split.

Globalization of migration is a process referring to migration in the global age at the turn of the 20th to the 21st century. With regard to the globalization of migration, global migration is a phenomenon referring to people on the move, determined by various push & pull factors.

Within the context of global migration, we are discussing contemporary migration trends, such as the asylum crisis in Europe, the unprecedented rise of the number of refugees, an increase in the proportion of female migrants in the total migrant population, the discrepancy in immigrant integration, the danger of terrorism and hostility towards migrants.

The European Union faces several challenges relating to the issues of globalization, demographic, climate changes, and their impact on migration, which are to be further elaborated in this project proposal, but also simultaneous reactionary processes in the form of renationalization, an anti-immigrant political discourse, the foundation of anti-immigrant parties and the rise of xenophobia in Europe.

We believe that a scientific approach is needed to develop regulation politics, scenarios and migration strategies.
